Course Outline

This week long course is designed for both the general and sub-specialty radiologist and is intended to provide an update of recent advances in relevant topics in breast, abdominal, thoracic, musculoskeletal and neuro imaging.

The presentations will focus on practical methods to optimize basic and advanced cross-sectional techniques for CT, MRI, Ultrasound and plain film, as well as how to recognize and avoid potential pitfalls in interpretation. Speakers will also discuss more advanced and emerging/evolving topics and technologies including multi-modality imaging of the breast, abdominal imaging techniques, and interventional procedures.

Daily sessions will conclude with questions and discussion between attendees and faculty.

Self-Assessment

This course will offer 25 Self-Assessment credits (pending approval and subject to change): 3.25 in Breast, 4.25 in Gastrointestinal, 3.0 in Genitourinary, 2.5 in Interventional, 2.25 in Musculoskeletal, 2.25 in Neuro, and 7.5 in Thoracic.

Course Objectives

1. Discuss the diagnostic approach to the incidental pulmonary nodule;
2. Understand the LI-RADS classification and significance for treatment of HCC;
3. Recognize spectrum of findings in the abdomen after ablation procedures;
4. Review the normal appearance of the larynx and nasopharynx;
5. Recognize normal anatomy and common pathological conditions in the shoulder, knee, and wrist;
6. Improve understanding of expected postoperative findings in the abdomen after commonly performed GI surgeries;
7. Apply recent advances in Breast MRI and understand the proper application of the BI-RADS lexicon to MR.

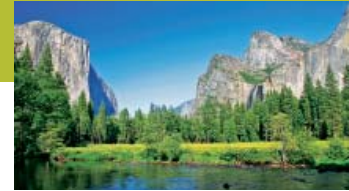

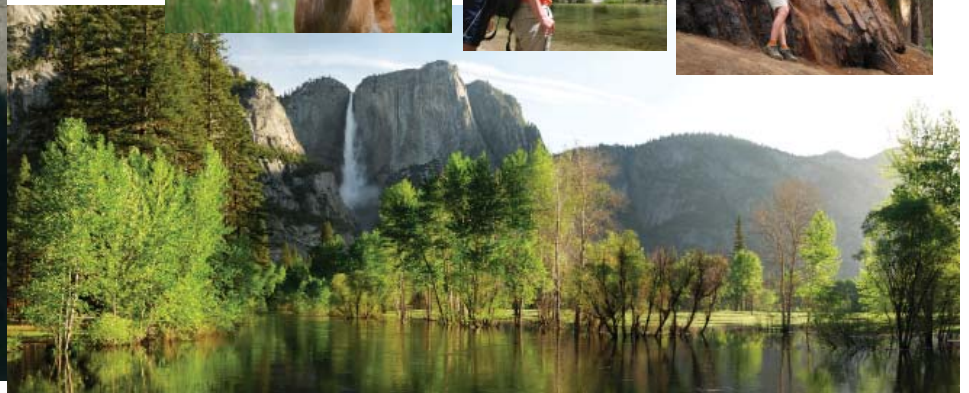

Yosemite National Park is a significant part of California's history, as well as a pivotal factor in the national parks movement. Home to four-thousand years of Native American cultural heritage, Yosemite has become a world heritage site, and has inspired the formation of the Sierra Club, which plays an important role in wildlife conservation and biological diversity preservation.

The Park embraces almost 1,200 square miles of scenic wild lands of the central Sierra Nevada range, from 2,000 to 13,000 feet above sea level. Highlights of Yosemite include the Tioga Road (a restored miner's mountain pass), Tuolumne Meadows, Yosemite Valley and Merced Canyon, Yosemite and Bridalveil Falls, and El Capitan and Half-Dome granite cliffs (including the largest exposed granite monolith and the greatest concentration of granite domes in the world).
